Subject: FY 2004 GYCC Project Funding

I am pleased to announce the selection of projects to receive GYCC funding in FY 2004. We received 69 project proposals and at least one project from each of your units. Thirty-six projects will receive funding from the GYCC pool of \$288,500 available this year (FY 04).

Projects were ranked based on the criteria listed below, with additional non-quantifiable consideration such as balancing funding across units and projects. Additional effort will be made to refine goals and objectives for each GYCC priority. This will allow the applicants and those selecting projects to better assess the relationship between proposed projects and the conservation fit to a priority. Selected projects typically ranked high in at least 2 of the 3 criteria:

Strategic fit: How well does the project meet GYCC priorities?

- Strong fit with GYCC priorities (lands, water, native trout, weeds);
- Meets second tier priorities (data mgmt, whitebark, T&E species, public info/rec);
- Important but not on priority list.

Application: How well does the project advance goals for the entire GYA versus a single unit?

- Benefits span the entire ecosystem; internal partnerships;
- Benefits more than 1 unit; internal partnerships;
- Primarily benefits 1 unit;

Leverage resources: How well does the project incorporate partnerships and leverage resources?

- Project funds are leveraged greater than 1:1match;
- Project funds are leveraged but less than 1:1 match;
- Project funds are not leveraged.

Project funds will be distributed to the forests, parks and refuge as soon as arrangements are finalized with budget offices. Interagency agreements will be necessary to transfer funds between units. Mary Maj will prepare the necessary interagency agreements for approval. To simplify this process, the Shoshone NF will serve as the transfer point for Yellowstone National Park projects, and the Bridger Teton NF will help facilitate transfer of funds to Grand Teton NP.

Our ability to compete for funds depends upon our ability to demonstrate results and accomplishments. A year-end report that summarizes project objectives, methods accomplishments and status is requested by November 30, 2004. Photos, reports, news clippings or other items of interest are appreciated.
